## **Competency Model for Dental Therapist**

**Dental Therapist** – A dental therapist is a licensed oral health professional who practices as part of the dental team to provide educational, clinical, and therapeutic patient services. There are two types of dental therapists in Minnesota; one is a traditional licensed Dental Therapist, and the other is a licensed Dental Therapist that has met certain criteria and achieved certification for Advanced Dental Therapist distinction. Dental Therapists and Advanced Dental Therapists have a specific scope of practice and are required to have a collaborative management agreement with dentists.

\*Pipeline recommends the industry-sector technical competencies as formal training opportunities (provided through related instruction) and the Occupation-Specific Competencies as on-the-job (OJT) training opportunities.

## **Industry-Sector Technical Competencies**

**Related Instruction** for dual training means the organized and systematic form of education resulting in the enhancement of skills and competencies related to the dual trainee's current or intended occupation.

- Assessment and treatment Know how to implement a comprehensive approach to clinical assessment and treatment. Focus on the effect of systemic and oral diseases related to care.
- **Pharmacology** Understand the patient's medical/dental health status and pharmacological report to discern appropriate treatment and necessary interventions.
- **Restorative dentistry** Understand dentistry techniques that restore form, function, and esthetics to teeth with the purpose of contributing to both oral and general health.
- **Clinical procedures** Know how to do core procedures in dentistry and preventive dentistry, how to accomplish them and the rationale behind them.
- **Pediatric dentistry** Knowledge of procedures for the pediatric and adolescent patient within the context of the collaborative agreement.

- **Oral health literacy** Understand health literacy and communication for individuals, families, and communities representing diverse backgrounds with strategies to provide equitable care for populations that may have experienced barriers in the past.
- **Peridotology** Knowledge of periodontal diseases, assessment and treatment options.
- Cariologoy Knowledge of dental caries and cariogenesis and how to perform fillings.
- **CPR/ medical emergencies** Know how to perform cardiopulminary resuscitation on adults, children and infants and perform medical emergency management.

## **Occupation-Specific Competencies**

**On-the-Job Training** is hands-on instruction completed at work to learn the core competencies necessary to succeed in an occupation. Common types of OJT include job shadowing, mentorship, cohort-based training, assignment-based project evaluation and discussion-based training.

- **Provide patient education** Be able to provide oral health instruction and disease prevention education to patients.
- **Perform mechanical polishing and application of topical agents** Know how to perform application of agents such as flouride varnishes and pit and fure sealants. Also, know how to work with desensitizing medication or resin.
- **Fabricate mouthguards and temporary restorations** Understand the fabrication of athletic mouthguards and soft occlusal guards and placement of temporary restorations.
- **Repair removable appliances** Understand the process of repairing and fitting of removable appliances so that gums heal and dentures function comfortably and properly.
- **Perform restorative dentistry** Understand restorative dentistry in which a tooth is reinserted and secured into its socket through dental procedures.
- Administer anesthetics Able to administer local anesthetics and nitrous oxide.
- Treat emergency dental pain Understand and know how to treat dental pain.
- **Prepare and place fillings and preformed crowns** Be able to prepare teeth and place preformed and temporary crowns and recement permanent crowns.
- **Conduct pulpotomies and pulp capping procedures** Understand procedures to prevent the pulp from being damaged in all teeth and to remove damaged pulp in primary teeth.

- **Perform tooth extraction and suture removal** Know how to remove teeth from the mouth and remove the stitches following oral surgery.
- Place and remove space maintainer devices Know how to perform placement and removal of space maintainers.
- **Perform brush biopsies** Be able to perform a technique to screen the oral cavity of individuals who have a high risk of developing mouth cancer.
- **Conduct tissue conditioning and soft reline** Know how to perform application of denture tissue conditioners and soft liners to improve denture fit, comfort, and function.
