### Worksheet and Code Change Proposal Review:

#### 1. Rulemaking Framework

- Reviewed a draft rule proposal for Minnesota Rule 1302.1000.
- Emphasis on creating a structured rule to avoid circular discussions.
- The rule will guide delegation of code administration for public buildings and state-licensed facilities.

#### 2. Project Registration

- Proposal to reinstate project registration for delegated projects.
- Discussion on using the IMS system for streamlined submissions.
- Concerns raised about turnaround time and impact on school project timelines.

#### 3. Fees

- Proposal to require municipalities to charge no less than state fees for delegated projects.
- Discussion on statutory conflicts (326B.107 Subd. 4) and potential need for legislative change.
- Clarified that the state fee would be a floor, not a ceiling.

#### 4. Delegation Categories

- Delegation agreements to be classified into four categories based on staff qualifications.
- Categories renamed from “levels” to “categories” for neutrality.

- Discussion on defining “complexity” and ensuring flexibility in project classification.

#### **5. Qualifications & Staffing**

- Proposed requirement: 4 years of experience for certain delegation levels.
- Debate on whether this is too restrictive, especially for rural jurisdictions.
- Clarified that both Certified Building Officials (CBO) and Building Official Limited (BOL) can qualify for reserved projects.

#### **6. Storm Shelters & Schools**

- Extensive discussion on whether storm shelters should remain in Category 4.
- Concerns about oversight and complexity led to consensus to keep them in Category 4.
- Charter schools confirmed to be included under “schools.”

#### **7. Audit & Oversight**

- Mixed opinions on including audit language.
- Some members supported audits for quality assurance; others feared it would deter participation.

#### **8. Perception & Participation**

- Feedback from ICC Southwest Chapter: most members hesitant to participate due to perceived complexity.
- Emphasis on need for outreach, education, and clarity to encourage adoption.
