CALL TO ORDER

Meeting was called to order by Chair McCarthy at 1:30 p.m.

4. New Business

A. Registered Apprenticeship Report:

Apprenticeship Director John Aiken reported the following:

Aiken reported that today they are about 11,500 strong in registered apprenticeship. They continue to see an increase since 2010. Last year eclipsed 12,000 for the first time in over a decade. They hope to get to that level this summer when construction ramps up again.

Active Apprentices by Industry Sector:

- Construction 90% are in construction
- Utilities Around 400 500 a year
- Advanced Manufacturing
- Healthcare
- Public
- Transportation/Auto
- Information Technology
- Agriculture

Aiken said that they are getting ready to celebrate the 80th Year of Apprenticeship in Minnesota. It was established April 1939 in this Department.

The Building and Construction Trades have been the stewards of this system that we have grown here to appreciate.

MINNESOTA APPRENTICESHIP INITIATIVE

5-year initiative to expand registered apprenticeship in Agriculture, Advanced Manufacturing, Healthcare, Information Technology and Transportation. Aiken said that this is in partnership with the Department of Employment and Economic Development.

Goal for fall 2020:

- Engage 100 employers in developing a registered apprenticeship model
- Develop 30 high-growth occupations
- Register 1,000 new apprentices

Results:

- 100+ employer engaged
- 42 new apprenticeship programs registered
- 380+ apprentices employed and registered
- 730+ apprentices pledged by participating employers

MINNESOTA APPRENTICESHIP EXPANSION INITIATIVE

Goals:

- Develop and launch apprenticeship communications and branding plan.
- Support and fund construction career-readiness program pilots specifically targeting women and minority populations (underrepresented in apprenticeship). Partners; Building Minnesota, Bricklayers and Allied Crafts, Cement Masons and Carpenters.
- Conduct construction employer engagement to identify and share recruitment and retention best practices.

Results:

- Supported 4 registered apprenticeship programs to provide construction-career readiness training for females and people of color: 216 individuals place in registered apprenticeship out of 308 served, 72% completion of programs, 70% placement in registered apprenticeship.
- Hosted first of its kind Apprenticeship Summit in Minnesota March 2018.
- Developed and launched the first communications and branding plan for apprenticeship in Minnesota. Currently soliciting an agency to support ongoing communications and outreach initiatives.
- Completed more than 18 construction employer and apprenticeship stakeholder meetings statewide to identify recruitment and retention best practices and barriers.

Aiken reported that additional funding through the Minnesota Apprenticeship Expansion Initiative will be available for:

- Make funding available for organization to host and support affinity and mentorship group
 activities with the goal of improving recruitment and retention of women and minorities in
 construction registered apprenticeship.
- Hosting statewide presentations with featured speakers on changing demographics and recruitment and retention of apprentices are taking place statewide throughout 2019.
- Providing over \$750,000 in funding opportunities to support construction career readiness and pre-apprenticeship funding over the next two years.
- Providing \$135,000 in funding to support seven career exploration programs.
- Researching methods to strengthen apprenticeship will take place throughout 2019.
- Soliciting marketing agencies to plan and implement a new Apprenticeship MN communications and outreach initiative to support apprentices and sponsors.

National Apprenticeship Week

Rick Martagon reported the following:

- Apprenticeship had 3 bus tours set up during apprenticeship week. One in St. Paul,
 Minneapolis, and Duluth. They saw 3 training centers for each bus tour.
- Martagon said they hosted Apprenticeship Panels hosted by Workforce Centers.
- Open Houses hosted by Apprenticeship programs.
- Apprenticeship Roundtables.
- Woman Building Success event at IBEW Local 110.
- Rochester Plumbers and Pipefitters New Training Center Open House.
- Apprenticeship Staff presence in various Training Centers.

B. Discussion and Approval of Registered Apprenticeship Report

A motion was made to accept Aiken's report as given and 2nd. All were in favor.

C. Construct Tomorrow Update

The January 30th St. Cloud event was closed due to weather. This will be rescheduled to March. February 2nd they will have an East Grand Forks event. February 21st a Hinckley event. The Hinckley event was very well attended. Rick reported that the teachers are getting the students prepped

ahead of time for these events. February 26^{th} & 27 in Duluth over 1,000 students will attend the 2-day event. Rick reported other events that Construct Tomorrow will be hosting.
