Arrowhead Economic Opportunity Agency

The [Arrowhead Economic Opportunity Agency](#) (AEOA) was incorporated in April 1965, as a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization and established as a Community Action Program (CAP) for the northeast Minnesota counties of St. Louis, Lake and Cook in response to the 1964 Economic Opportunity Act. AEOA offers services in these counties and the nine neighboring counties of Aitkin, Carlton, Cass, Chisago, Crow Wing, Isanti, Itasca, Koochiching and Pine making it one of the largest private, non-profit Community Action Agencies in Minnesota.

Bi-County Community Action Programs

[Bi-County CAP](#) is a non-profit agency that oversees the grants and programming for Bi-County CAP YouthBuild. YouthBuild is a pre-apprenticeship construction training program for opportunity youth ages 16 to 24. They are partnered with Cass Lake-Bena school district and Cass County ABE to provide curriculum and in-house teaching for our youth to pursue diploma, GED, or adult diploma. As a group, they teach employability soft skills as well as hands-on constructions skills while building one house every two years, with 54 youth enrolled over that duration. Youth receive two days per week in the classroom and two days per week on the construction site. Youth work Mon-Thurs, 8 to 4 and are paid a wage for their time in the program. The program is a 6 month paid opportunity, with extended oversight beyond that, for youth that need support or time to finish their diploma. They also receive a full year of follow up after program exit. Their program utilizes NCCER (National center for Construction Education and Research) curriculum for construction training. They also offer CNA certification, First Aid CPR, OSHA 10 and 30 certification, and more for those looking to get into a particular field or build their resume. They also offer assistance in acquiring driver's permits and licenses.

LSS has established pathways and programs to increase access to career success, with a focus on individuals with high barriers to success.

Our program helps individuals who are at risk of losing or have lost their jobs through no fault of their own to re-enter the workforce by providing career counseling, training, and financial support. They help participants gain competitive skills for in-demand industries, secure employment with comparable wages to their previous job, and support job retention. They assist with occupational skills training, on-the-job training, incumbent worker training, registered apprenticeships, and much more. The program is funded by state and federal grants and is available at no cost to eligible participants who are eligible or receiving unemployment insurance benefits.
