Arrowhead Economic Opportunity Agency

The [Arrowhead Economic Opportunity Agency](#) (AEOA) was incorporated in April 1965 as a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization and established as a Community Action Program (CAP) for the northeast Minnesota counties of St. Louis, Lake and Cook in response to the 1964 Economic Opportunity Act. AEOA offers services in these counties and the nine neighboring counties of Aitkin, Carlton, Cass, Chisago, Crow Wing, Isanti, Itasca, Koochiching and Pine making it one of the largest private, non-profit Community Action Agencies in Minnesota.

Some programs include paid training, and all participants are assisted by Avivo's career counselors for job placement

The program is funded by state and federal grants and is available at no cost to participants who are eligible or receiving unemployment insurance benefits.
