

Georgia contractor fined for unlicensed work in Minnesota

A contractor operating out of Cummings and Alpharetta, Georgia, was found to have engaged in unlicensed electrical work in Minnesota. The contractor was ordered to cease and desist from the unlicensed activities and fined \$6,000.



An Eagan contractor was found to have engaged in unlicensed residential building construction and plumbing work. The contractor was ordered to cease and desist from the unlicensed activities and fined \$7,500, of which \$6,500 was stayed contingent on full future compliance.

A St. Paul contractor was found to have performed plumbing work without the required contractor license. The contractor was ordered to cease and desist from the unlicensed activities and fined \$4,000, of which \$3,000 was stayed contingent on full future compliance.

A Brooklyn Park contractor was found to have engaged in residential building construction, electrical and plumbing work without having the required licenses. The contractor was ordered to cease and desist from the unlicensed activities and fined \$45,000, of which \$30,000 was stayed contingent on full future compliance.

A Belle Plaine contractor was found to have engaged in residential remodeling work without being licensed. The contractor was ordered to cease and desist from the unlicensed activities and fined \$27,500, of which \$20,000 was stayed contingent on full future compliance.
